The organization sponsored its first state wide student conference in 1959 at Texas A&M. It moved to Austin in 1968 and to Waco in 1976 where it is still located.

What is now known as Brazos Valley held its first contest at Cy-Fair H.S in 1961 and moved to Sam Houston University in 1976. In 2007 the BV will relocate its Regional Contest to the Berry Center in CY-Fair ISD.

Texas is divided into 20 regions. Brazos Valley is strongest region in the State both in membership and student participation.
